2nd world conference on mountain ungulates, St. Vincent - Aosta, Italy, 5 - 7 May 1997

Mountain ungulates pose special management problems. Their conservation deserves priority for both the sake of preserving the biological diversity in mountain ecosystems and for the economical benefits that a wise management can generate. Although by all means this conference is not limited to conservation issues only, the organizers encourage potential participants to emphasize conservation in their papers.

The conference will be held in St. Vincent, a small town in the heart of the Aosta Valley: 86 km from Torino, 156 km from Milano. A public railway service connects the stations of Torino and Milano with Chatillon-St. Vincent (Torino-Aosta and Torino Milano lines). A bus service will be organized by the conference organizers from the airports and central station of Torino and Milano.

Conference registration fees

Full - until 15 February 1997, 150,000 Italian lira - after 15 February 1997, 230,000 Italian lira Students - 65,000 until, and 100,000 Italian lira after 15th February.

Program

The conference will include two days of meetings and one full day of excursion. A post-conference excursion will be organized at Gran Paradiso National Park, to watch the Alpine Ibex and Chamois.

- 6 May 1997 invited lectures, oral sessions, workshops and round tables; poster sessions.
 - 7 May 1997 post-conference excursion.

The conference will be held in the Congress Centre of the Grand Hotel Billia.
